Pill bug 2 cm.



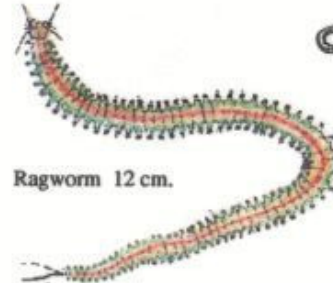
Broad clawed porcelain crab 12 mm.

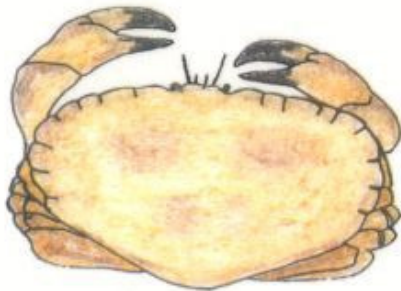

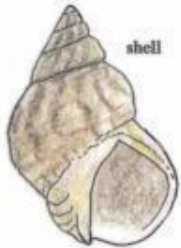

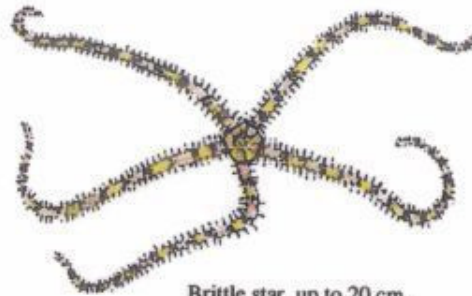

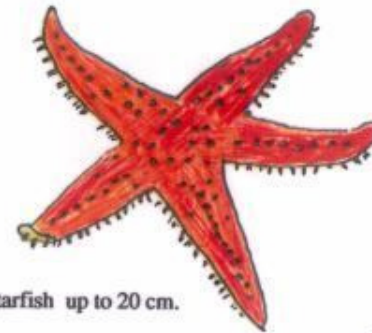

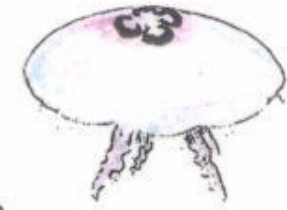

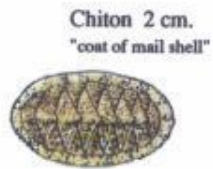
Often found stranded on the shore or in rockpools.

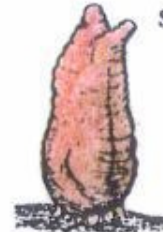

shown growing on kelp



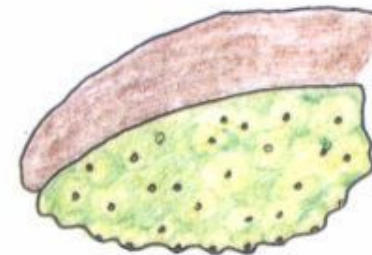
Sea squirt 3 cm.
